COURSE WORK : (Regulation No : 9) Registered Full time/Part-time Ph.D., candidates shall undertake course work of one semester (16 weeks), normally in the Parent Department within one year from the date of provisional registration, failing which his/her registration shall be cancelled. However, if it is found necessary, course work may be carried out by doctoral candidates in sister Departments/Institutes/Research Centers recognized by the University for which due credit shall be given to such candidates.

RESEARCH PROPOSAL : Confirmation of Registration (Regulation No : 12.0) After the completion of course work, Ph.D candidates (Full-time/Part-time) are required to submit their research proposals on the chosen topic to the Doctoral Committee in the prescribed format framed by the respective Faculty, but not later than a year from the date of provisional registration.

The candidate shall prepare the Research Proposal/Outline defining clearly the objectives, methodology, literature survey, work plan and relevance of the proposed research and shall present a pre-registration colloquium before the Doctoral Committee.
